





The collective percentage of people's comments on private and state media:



The Importance of Evaluating Feedback

Assessing feedback, both positive and negative, on media and social networks involves recognizing and giving consideration to people's opinions. Analyzing and sharing such feedback enables individuals and society to express their perspectives, requests, criticisms, and suggestions concerning the government's economic decisions, actions, and projects.

Social Media Usage in Afghanistan

Most Afghans use Facebook, while government officials, institutions, and various political, economic, social, and cultural activists tend to prefer Twitter. Nevertheless, both governmental and non-governmental institutions, as well as political, economic, social, and cultural activists, are actively present on Facebook and Twitter, providing coverage of public and official individuals and institutions and publishing daily official and unofficial news and reports.

Evaluation and Analysis of Public Comments on Media Coverage of the published news

We can divide the media into two categories: government media and private media:

The number of positive and negative comments and suggestions left by the public on both types of media regarding the published news are analyzed.

Firstly, the comments on state media, including websites, Twitter pages, and spokespersons, are evaluated. A total of 1270 comments are recorded, out of which 1161 are positive, 79 are negative, and 30 provide constructive feedback. The percentages of positive, negative, and constructive feedback are 91%, 6%, and 3%, respectively.

Secondly, comments on private media, such as television, radio, newspapers, and news agencies, are analyzed. A total of 151 comments are recorded, out of which 120 are positive, 20 are negative, and 11 provide constructive feedback. The percentages of positive, negative, and constructive feedback are 79%, 13%, and 8%, respectively.

Overall, the percentage of positive comments is higher on state media than on private media. However, private media has a higher percentage of negative comments. When combining the positive, negative, and constructive feedback, the total number of comments is 1281 positive, 99 negative, and 41 constructive, with the percentages being 90%, 7%, and 3%, respectively.

Why do public media receive a higher percentage of positive comments than private media?

One explanation for this phenomenon is that the government's initiatives and decisions are often covered extensively by state media outlets. For instance, the published news related to the government has been widely disseminated through these channels. While state media sources have garnered a high percentage of positive feedback for this news, private media outlets have also received praise with comments expressing approval. It appears that each news report generates an increasing number of comments, indicating that the public closely monitors the government's actions and provides their opinions on them.

A summary of people's comments on media and social networks is as follows:

It is important to note that the comments presented here are only a small sample of the hundreds of comments received, including both positive and negative feedback and suggestions.

- We strongly advocate for a stringent nationwide ban on the use of foreign currencies, particularly the PKR, and endorse conducting all transactions exclusively in Afghanis. It is imperative that we unite in championing this cause.
- In accordance with the World Bank's report, the declining inflation trend must be diligently sustained. Furthermore, it is worth noting that while the Afghani's strengthening against the dollar has a positive impact on food prices, fuel and medicine costs remain unaffected. Conversely, a depreciation of the Afghani results in price hikes. The Islamic Emirate should exercise control over these market dynamics to ensure stability.
- Afghanistan's overall situation is promising, with the exception of the pressing issue of high unemployment rates. Improving the economy is the key to resolving this challenge and fostering a brighter future for our nation.

After analyzing people's comments on social media and the media in general, several key topics have emerged.

First, numerous individuals have expressed their strong desire for a ban on the use of Pakistani Rupees (PKR) and have advocated for all transactions to be conducted exclusively in Afghanis. This issue holds significant importance, as every nation's unique currency serves as a symbol of its identity. Moreover, it's well understood that a country's currency can lose its value when it is underutilized for transactions. We've witnessed how the Afghani depreciated against foreign currencies during times when Afghanistan lacked a centralized government. Now, with a robust and centralized governance system in place, it is incumbent upon us to promote and prioritize our national currency. The Islamic Emirate has taken resolute measures to achieve this objective, implementing strict measures in all provinces where PKR transactions were prevalent. The Islamic Emirate has earnestly encouraged the use of Afghani instead of PKR, backed by the threat of legal action against any violators. As a result, the overwhelming majority of transactions within the country are now conducted in Afghanis, leading to a steady appreciation of the Afghani's value against foreign currencies. Under the decree of Amir al-Mu'minin Sheikh Al-Hadith Maulvi Hibatullah Akhund, a comprehensive ban on PKR usage has been instituted nationwide. This prohibition encompasses the possession, trade, and any form of utilization of PKR. All provincial governors and district officials have been instructed that, within a two-month period, PKR transactions will be strictly forbidden, with legal consequences for those who fail to comply. These measures reflect our commitment to strengthening our national currency and preserving our economic sovereignty.

- Second, another noteworthy observation made by individuals in their comments is the decreasing trend in inflation. This observation aligns with the findings in the World Bank's report, which underscores a reduction in the inflation rate. This positive development can be attributed to several factors. First and foremost, the increase in domestic food production has played a pivotal role in curbing inflationary pressures. Additionally, the strengthening of the national currency against foreign counterparts has contributed significantly to this decline. A decrease in the prices of both essential and non-essential goods has also had a favorable impact. Moreover, improvements within the banking sector, particularly the provision of tailored services for commercial enterprises, have fostered economic growth. This growth, in turn, has led to an increase in job opportunities, a rise in both exports and the national income, and a balanced trade scenario. It's worth noting that there are several other factors at play that collectively contribute to the reduction in the inflation rate. The Islamic Emirate has actively pursued these strategies and continues to do so, with a strong commitment to maintaining a low inflation rate. These efforts reflect our dedication to ensuring economic stability and prosperity for our nation.

7 Large Mining Contracts Signed with an Investment of 6.5 Billion Dollars

The utilization of economic resources stands as a paramount necessity for the continued existence of human life on Earth. This monumental investment signifies the Islamic Emirate's unwavering dedication to unlocking Afghanistan's mineral potential and forging a path toward economic prosperity. These contracts not only mark a significant stride forward for Afghanistan but also contribute to the global economic landscape, emphasizing the indispensable role that mineral resources play in our interconnected world.

Guided by the Economic Commission of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan, the Ministry of Mines and Petroleum initiated an open bidding process for the extraction of four sections of the iron ore mine in the Ghorian district of Herat province. Following an extensive and transparent evaluation, the following enterprises have been declared as the winners: Watan Dorokhshan Company, in which Azaran Industrial Structures Company holds a 70% stake, has secured the first section of the iron ore mine in the Ghorian district with an impressive score of 64.6 points. Sahil Middle East Mining & Logistics Company whose shareholders are Dara-e-Noor, an Afghan company and Epcol, a Turkish company each 15%, has secured the second section of the iron ore mine in the Ghorian district with a score of 61 points. Shamsh, an Afghan company, with GBM and AD Resources, British companies, as its 35% shareholders, has emerged as the winner for the third section of the iron ore mine in the Ghorian district with a score of 68.5 points. Bakhtar Steel Company, with Ahya Sepahan and Parsian Iranian companies holding a 49% stake, has secured the fourth section of the iron ore mine in the Ghorian district with a score of 60.50 points.







The collective percentage of people's comments on private and state media:



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Evaluation and Analysis of Public Comments on Media Coverage of the published news

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The number of positive and negative comments and suggestions left by the public on both types of media regarding the published news are analyzed.

Firstly, the comments on state media, including websites, Twitter pages, and spokespersons, are evaluated. A total of 3558 comments are recorded, out of which 3227 are positive, 238 are negative, and 93 provide constructive feedback. The percentages of positive, negative, and constructive feedback are 91%, 7%, and 2%, respectively.

Secondly, comments on private media, such as television, radio, newspapers, and news agencies, are analyzed. A total of 3735 comments are recorded, out of which 2655 are positive, 692 are negative, and 388 provide constructive feedback. The percentages of positive, negative, and constructive feedback are 71%, 19%, and 10%, respectively.

Overall, the percentage of positive comments is higher on state media than on private media. However, private media has a higher percentage of negative comments. When combining the positive, negative, and constructive feedback, the total number of comments is 5882 positive, 930 negative, and 481 constructive, with the percentages being 81%, 13%, and 6%, respectively.



The collective percentage of people's comments on private and state media:





Despite having abundant water and resources for power generation, decades of war and foreign intervention have hindered Afghans from harnessing their natural energy potential. The previous administration in Kabul resorted to importing electricity from neighboring countries, paying scant attention to domestic power generation. With the end of the American occupation and the re-establishment of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan, concerted efforts have been initiated to address this longstanding issue, among others. Most Afghans use Facebook, while government officials, institutions, and various political, economic, social, and cultural activists tend to prefer Twitter. Nevertheless, both governmental and non-governmental institutions, as well as political, economic, social, and cultural activists, are actively present on Facebook and Twitter, providing coverage of public and official individuals and institutions and publishing daily official and unofficial news and reports.

The evaluation and analysis of people's comments on media about the news report:

In this evaluation, the media is divided into two categories: state and private media.

The number of positive and negative comments and suggestions left by the public on both types of media regarding the published news are analyzed.

Firstly, the comments on state media, including websites, Twitter pages, and spokespersons, are evaluated. A total of 1317 comments are recorded, out of which 1221 are positive, 64 are negative, and 32 provide constructive feedback. The percentages of positive, negative, and constructive feedback are 93%, 5%, and 2%, respectively.

Secondly, comments on private media, such as television, radio, newspapers, and news agencies, are analyzed. A total of 343 comments are recorded, out of which 281 are positive, 41 are negative, and 21 provide constructive feedback. The percentages of positive, negative, and constructive feedback are 82%, 12%, and 6%, respectively.

Overall, the percentage of positive comments is higher on state media than on private media. However, private media has a higher percentage of negative comments. When combining the positive, negative, and constructive feedback, the total number of comments is 1502 positive, 105 negative, and 53 constructive, with the percentages being 90%, 6%, and 4%, respectively.

Why do public media receive a higher percentage of positive comments than private media?

The Economic Commission Approved the Procedure Established for the Mine Protection



Introduction

Introduction: The Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan is funding all of its domestic development projects through local revenue and mining resources. Recently, the National Procurement Commission, led by Deputy Prime Minister for Economic Affairs, Mullah Abdul Ghani Baradar Akhund, approved 25 projects across various sectors, with a total value of 7 billion Afghanis. Furthermore, in addition to ongoing initiatives like the Qosh Tepe Canal, Salang Highway, and Kabul-Kandahar Road, there are numerous projects in mining, water management, healthcare, and agriculture currently in progress. This clearly demonstrates the Islamic Emirate's commitment to driving the nation's development independently, fostering economic stability in the process.

Meeting Highlights: On September 20, 2023, the regular session of the Economic Commission convened under the leadership of Deputy Prime Minister for Economic Affairs, Mullah Abdul Ghani Baradar Akhund, at Marmarin Palace. Various agenda items were discussed and thoroughly examined by the Economic Commission. After comprehensive deliberation, the Economic Commission resolved that the Ministry of Mines and Petroleum should initiate an open bidding process for the geophysical surveys of the Kashk-Tirpul oil field, a vast area covering 10 blocks totaling 23,000 square kilometers, spanning 13 districts in Herat and Badghis provinces.

Furthermore, during the meeting, a decision was made to dispatch a delegation comprising representatives from the Ministry of National Defense, Interior, and Finance, alongside the Deputy

Head of the General Directorate of Intelligence, to inspect the nation's ports. This delegation, with the support of the National Standards Authority, will thoroughly investigate concerns related to subpar oil quality and overloading in tanker shipments and subsequently present their findings to the Economic Commission.

In line with fostering public-private collaboration, the Economic Commission gave preliminary approval for the design of a passenger vehicle terminal in Guzare district, Herat province, and the construction of Tir Park in Aqeena Port, Faryab province. These projects, slated for completion within two years, entail an investment of approximately two billion Afghanis and are expected to generate employment opportunities for hundreds of individuals, adhering to established transportation principles.

The Economic Commission's Technical Committee conducted a comprehensive review of contract prices for the fluorite mine in Nish district, Kandahar province, with the aim of enhancing them. Following the committee's investigation, the Economic Commission set a price of 15,000 Afghanis per ton for fluorite.

With regard to the Laghman Shahi Canal project, the Economic Commission entrusted the Ministry of Agriculture, Irrigation and Livestock, as well as Water and Energy, to jointly carry out the remaining technical assessments and delineate their responsibilities for the project. It was also decided that the expenses for constructing the canal should be included in the development budget for the 1403 fiscal year.

The Economic Commission addressed the need to supply electricity to Qosh Tepa and Darzab districts in Jawzjan province. They decided that, in exchange for a mine, the forthcoming electricity line from Turkmenistan should be extended from Shaberghan's center to these districts to address the concerns of local residents.

In a bid to improve services for citizens and create necessary facilities in Torkham port, the Economic Commission resolved to allocate 540 jeribs of land to the Ministry of Finance for the construction of relevant institutions.

In a separate decision, the Economic Commission permitted the transfer of dry firewood in Khost, Paktia, Paktika, and Logar provinces, with the condition of providing a guarantee. A designated delegation was tasked with developing a comprehensive forest protection procedure for future purposes, to be presented to the Economic Commission for approval.

The Economic Commission also endorsed the Ministry of Mines and Petroleum's established procedure for mine protection. It tasked the Ministry of Mines with convening a meeting with the National Enterprise of Public Protection to address any outstanding issues. The National Enterprise of Public Protection is expected to enhance and organize mine protection units throughout the country to deter illegal and arbitrary mining activities.

During the Economic Commission meeting, it was resolved that the report created by the Ministry of Water and Energy and Da Afghanistan Breshna Sherkat regarding the electricity supply for Uruzgan province should be transmitted to the office of the leadership of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan. Subsequently, actions should be taken in accordance with the provided guidance.

Additionally, within the same meeting, a committee composed of representatives from the Ministry of Urban Development and Housing, Arzaq State-owned Company, and Kabul Municipality was charged with the responsibility of establishing a fruit and vegetable market within the vicinity of the company situated in the fifth district of Kabul. They were instructed to formulate a comprehensive plan in accordance with urban principles and present it for approval at the next Economic Commission meeting.


Lastly, concerning the utilization of Ghori and Jabal Al Saraj cement in construction projects, a joint committee was formed, consisting of a representative from the Deputy Prime Minister's Office for Economic Affairs, along with representatives from the Ministries of Public Works, Rural Rehabilitation and Development, Urban Development and Housing, as well as the National Development Corporation and the National Standards Authority. This committee was tasked with conducting quality tests and delivering their findings to the Economic Commission within five weeks for the final decision.





The total percentage of evaluation of private and state media:





The total percentage of evaluation of private and state media:



Nevertheless, both governmental and non-governmental institutions, as well as political, economic, social, and cultural activists, are actively present on Facebook and Twitter, providing coverage of public and official individuals and institutions and publishing daily official and unofficial news and reports.

Evaluation and Analysis of Public Comments on Media Coverage of the published news

In this evaluation, the media is divided into two categories: state and private media.

The number of positive and negative comments and suggestions left by the public on both types of media regarding the published news are analyzed.

Firstly, the comments on state media, including websites, Twitter pages, and spokespersons, are evaluated. A total of 3408 comments are recorded, out of which 3160 are positive, 175 are negative, and 73 provide constructive feedback. The percentages of positive, negative, and constructive feedback are 93%, 5%, and 2%, respectively.

Secondly, comments on private media, such as television, radio, newspapers, and news agencies, are analyzed. A total of 2326 comments are recorded, out of which 1656 are positive, 805 are negative, and 162 provide constructive feedback. The percentages of positive, negative, and constructive feedback are 71%, 22%, and 7%, respectively.

Overall, the percentage of positive comments is higher on state media than on private media. However, private media has a higher percentage of negative comments. When combining the positive, negative, and constructive feedback, the total number of comments is 4816 positive, 683 negative, and 235 constructive, with the percentages being 84%, 14%, and 2%, respectively.

Why do public media receive a higher percentage of positive comments than private media?

One explanation for this phenomenon is that the government's initiatives and decisions are often covered extensively by state media outlets. For instance, the published news related to the government has been widely disseminated through these channels. While state media sources have garnered a high percentage of positive feedback for this news, private media outlets have also received praise with comments expressing approval. It appears that each news report generates an increasing number of comments, indicating that the public closely monitors the government's actions and provides their opinions on them.

A summary of people's comments on media and social networks is as follows:









Social Media Usage in Afghanistan

Most Afghans use Facebook, while government officials, institutions, and various political, economic, social, and cultural activists tend to prefer Twitter. Nevertheless, both governmental and non-governmental institutions, as well as political, economic, social, and cultural activists, are actively present on Facebook and Twitter, providing coverage of public and official individuals and institutions and publishing daily official and unofficial news and reports.

Evaluation and Analysis of Public Comments on Media Coverage of the published news

In this evaluation, the media is divided into two categories: state and private media.

The number of positive and negative comments and suggestions left by the public on both types of media regarding the published news are analyzed.

Firstly, the comments on state media, including websites, Twitter pages, and spokespersons, are evaluated. A total of 1350 comments are recorded, out of which 1306 are positive, 30 are negative, and 14 provide constructive feedback. The percentages of positive, negative, and constructive feedback are 97%, 2%, and 1%, respectively.

Secondly, comments on private media, such as television, radio, newspapers, and news agencies, are analyzed. A total of 261 comments are recorded, out of which 202 are positive, 43 are negative, and 16 provide constructive feedback. The percentages of positive, negative, and constructive feedback are 77%, 16%, and 7%, respectively.

Overall, the percentage of positive comments is higher on state media than on private media. However, private media has a higher percentage of negative comments. When combining the positive, negative, and constructive feedback, the total number of comments is 1508 positive, 73 negative, and 30 constructive, with the percentages being 94%, 4%, and 1.5%, respectively.

Why do public media receive a higher percentage of positive comments than private media?

One explanation for this phenomenon is that the government's initiatives and decisions are often covered extensively by state media outlets. For instance, the published news related to the government has been widely disseminated through these channels. While state media sources have garnered a high percentage of positive feedback for this news, private media outlets have also received praise with comments expressing approval. It appears that each news report generates an increasing number of comments, indicating that the public closely monitors the government's actions and provides their opinions on them.

A summary of people's comments on media and social networks is as follows:

It is important to note that the comments presented here are only a small sample of the hundreds of comments received, including both positive and negative feedback and suggestions.

- Mullah Abdul Ghani Baradar Akhund is not only a compassionate advocate for the oppressed and vulnerable Afghans but also a revered figure among the present-day population of Afghanistan. May Allah grant him good health and a long life.
- A bountiful harvest is the outcome of quality seeds, proper planting, and appropriate chemical fertilizers. Government authorities must take action against companies importing substandard seeds into the country.
- & Establishing a market for agricultural products through organized exhibitions would be highly beneficial. Currently, everything is being sold at reduced prices, leaving farmers with minimal returns.

After analyzing people's comments on social media and the media in general, several key topics have emerged.

The strategic use of exhibitions serves as a vital tool in creating awareness and demand for Afghan agricultural products.





The total percentage of evaluation of private and state media:



A total of 768 comments are recorded, out of which 616 are positive, 98 are negative, and 54 provide constructive feedback. The percentages of positive, negative, and constructive feedback are 80%, 13%, and 7%, respectively.

Overall, the percentage of positive comments is higher on state media than on private media. However, private media has a higher percentage of negative comments. When combining the positive, negative, and constructive feedback, the total number of comments is 2985 positive, 202 negative, and 104 constructive, with the percentages being 91%, 6%, and 3%, respectively.
